

The University of Luxembourg conferred the award for excellence in teaching to Damien Negre

Damien Negre is one of them. Damien is a doctoral researcher and a teacher at the Faculty of Law. He was awarded the prize for his pedagogical skills and for the accomplishments he achieved in coaching students of the Consumer Law Clinic, especially in their task to support the University staff for obtaining the reimbursement of their flight tickets during the lockdown. Last year, Damien was instrumental in bringing the “Clinicity Project” to life. This program promotes the field of legal research and connects master and high school students. Damien’s enthusiasm for the project spread among his students improving their role as researchers and educators for the high schoolers.

During the award ceremony, he was celebrated for the positive energy he brings to the Faculty and for the way he helps students in developing their critical thinking skills.

According to the Rector of the University, Prof. Stéphane Pallage: “Our teachers who received a Teaching Award today are role models. Their teaching is intrinsically linked to research. They take students to the frontier of knowledge, where discoveries are made. They are explorers of the 21st century”.
